




Award of the Study Tourney **BILEK-75 JT**

Theme: In an endgame study with win or draw stipulation some (more is better) unprotected pieces (not pawns) are not captured. At least two variants are required. The theme can be shown in the start position or during the play.

Many thanks to all participants of the tourney “Istvan Bilek-75 JT”. We received 20 studies from these 16 composers: **Iuri Akobia** (Georgia), **Yuri Bazlov** (Russia), **Richard Becker** (USA), **Pal Benno** (Hungary), **Aleksei Gasparian** (Armenia), **David Gurgenzidze** (Georgia), **Marco Campioli** (Italy), **Sergeiy Didukh** (Ukraine), **Lutz-Dieter Gruber** (Germany), **Gerhard Josten** (Germany), **Daniel Keith** (France), **Vitalyi Kovalenko** (Russia), **Martin Minski** (Germany), **Sergei Osintsev** (Russia), **Pietro Rossi** (Italy), **Boris Sidorov** (Russia). The prize-winning composers connected the repetition of the theme with artistic contents. The following 9 studies are nominated in this award.
