
HCCW 15 JT Final Award - Orthodox Section

I thank János Mikitovics for the offer to judge this interesting tournament. I appreciate it especially because Hungary is the country that we can consider the cradle of the modern help mate and which gave the world many excellent composers in this genre.

A note to the chosen theme: at first glance it appears that it is strategically demanding and offers many rich opportunities for inclusion. But unfortunately that is not the case. A strict adherence to the theme has lead to the usage of only a few mechanisms of creation of white batteries, I've counted 6 of them in the selection, the back piece of the battery is included as the first: R - B, B - R, B - S, R - S, R - P, B - P. Additionally the capture of the front thematic battery piece in the third phase was often added only as a "necessary evil", as if the composers didn't even consider it as a component of the theme. I preferred the problems, which included the active sacrifice of such a piece, or at least the cancellation of its cover from the white side and I preferred quality of solutions before quantity. The highest awards were therefore given to the problems which managed to at least partially escape the delineated narrow frame and/or they contributed something extra to the theme.

The organizer provided me with 42 numbered problems in a unified anonymous form. I awarded the following problems:



Battery type P-R. Unlike the rest of the competing problems this one includes a hint black strategy – the black queen picks three times which field to move to when unpinning the white rook. There is a nice addition of three analogical mates, two of which in form a Chameleonecho.
